Easy Garage

Happy Tree Village's drivers park their favorite Hot Wheels and Matchbox cars in garages. Let's make one, it's easy and fun!

You will need:



Tools: template pattern (attached), scissors, paintbrushes. Optional: ruler, markers, masking tape
Materials: cardboard, school glue, acrylic paints
Cost: about 50 cents worth of glue and paint.
Time: about an hour.

Cardboard, glue and paint



A garage for Hot Wheels



1. Cut pieces

Base, 3 walls (one piece), roof. See template below.

2. Glue and tape

Fold the 3 walls on the dotted lines and glue them to the base. Fold the roof-garage door piece and glue to tops of the 3 walls, but don't glue the door down.

3. Paint

Once glue is dry, paint. It's a good idea to prime everything with white paint first and let that dry, then paint any colors you like. You can also use markers or stickers, anything you want!

Happy Tree Village has a working garage now. See it at the corner of 3rd and Cota downtown.
